## SO YOU THINK YOUR SCHOOL'S TOUGH HUH?

WHEN LITTLE Amy Carter, daughter of Jimmy, begins the best days of her life at a Washington state school in the New Year, she may find out that there's more to life than the White House and the Bicentennial.

Despite Mr Carter's well intentioned democracy — or condescending publicity stunting, depending on your point of view — he's not being too smart in sending his kid to any state school, especially one in Washington D.C.; "Jungle Warfare Training Camps", as they're popularly know.
